Ice Dams.... What do they do?



- Trap melted snow water on your roof
- Water backs up under shingles and leaks into your attic
- This water damages decking, insulation, rafters, and structural wood
- **Causes water stains on ceilings and walls, mold, and potential rot**

What is Felt Underlayment Supposed to Do?




- Protect roof deck from moisture
- Provide backup if shingles fall
- Prevent shingle/deck contact issues
- Add fire resistance

What Happens When Your Felt Doesn't Protect Your Decking?

Drip Edge



What Does Drip Edge Do?



- **Directs water away from the fascia and into the gutters**
- **Protects the edges of the roof deck from water damage and rot**
- **Provides a clean, finished look to the roofline**



Starter Course



What Does Starter Course Do?



- **Creates a secure base layer at the roof edge** for the first row of shingles
- **Prevents wind uplift** by sealing the eave and rake edges
- **Helps block water infiltration** at the most vulnerable roof edges
- **Improves adhesion and durability** with factory-applied adhesive strips

Flashings



What Do Flashings Do?



- Prevent leaks where roofing surfaces meet vertical walls or penetrations
- Protect against long-term moisture damage in critical spots
- Allow for movement and flexibility between roof components without cracking





Pipe Boots



What Do Pipe Boots Do?



- **Seal** around plumbing vent pipes that penetrate the roof
- **Prevent** water from leaking into the home through pipe openings
- **Flex** with roof movement and temperature changes to maintain a watertight seal

Neoprene Pipe Boot



- Vulnerable to UV radiation
- Cannot endure extreme temperatures
- Cracks due to bad weather
- Older technology and shorter lifespan




Why Does Your Roof Need Ventilation?



- **Regulates attic temperature** to reduce heat buildup in summer
- **Helps prevent moisture buildup** that can lead to mold, mildew, and rot
- **Extends the lifespan of your roof** by reducing heat and moisture stress
- **Reduces risk of ice dams** during winter by maintaining balanced temperatures
- **Improves energy efficiency**, which can lower cooling costs
- **Meets manufacturer warranty requirements** and local building codes

Ventilation Types



Ridge Vent is the Newest and Best Ventilation System Technology



- **Promotes attic airflow** – allow hot, humid air to escape from the attic at the roof's peak
- **Reduces heat buildup** – help lower attic temperatures, reducing cooling costs and strain on HVAC
- **Prevents moisture damage** – minimize condensation that can lead to mold, rot, and mildew
- **Extends roof life** – keep shingles cooler and drier, reducing premature aging
- **Low-profile appearance** – blends seamlessly into the roofline for a clean, finished look

Ridge Cap Shingles



What Do Ridge Cap Shingles Do?



- **Seal the roof's peak** – protect the most vulnerable area of the roof where two slopes meet
- **Allow for attic ventilation** – designed to work with ridge vents to help release hot, moist air
- **Prevent water intrusion** – overlap to shed water away from the ridge and avoid leaks
- **Resist wind uplift** – specially designed to stay secure on ridgelines, even in high winds
- **Finish the roof with a clean look** – provide a polished, uniform finish to your roof's peak





